Tuesday – 1

Praise God for the upcoming launch of FEBC's fifth radio station in Ukraine, located in Nikolaevka. Pray that many people will tune into the new station and find hope in Christ.

Wednesday – 2

Pray for Alex Jaruchik, part-time staff w/Russian Ministries who has returned from Ukraine, where he noted much has changed, but not the needs of people, who need the Lord. Alex was able to preach the Gospel to soldiers on the frontlines from FEBC's broadcast center in Kiev. Please pray that God will bless Alex's work, so that many listeners will find Jesus through his programs.

Evgeny is actively using new media tools to reach his audience: hundreds of thousands listen to him on different social network platforms, and thousands respond. While one third of the responses consist of young people making fun of Evgeny for his faith, two-thirds indicate a deep hunger for real answers to life’s dilemmas. Among responses are more than a dozen averted teen suicides; Russia still holds the first place in the world in this grim statistic.

Monday – 14
