

## FEBC Russian Ministries Prayer Focus

July 2019

Monday – 1

Please pray for Evgeny Sarapulov, an FEBC broadcaster in Moscow. Evgeny receives thousands of responses from his listeners who received help through his programs and were saved. Pray that God will continue to bless Evgeny's broadcasts and his listeners. Also, pray for his family: his wife and four children. Pray that all Evgeny's children will serve the Lord.

Tuesday – 2

Evgeny Sarapulov received this letter from a listener:

“In 2018 I was in a terrible depression. My husband was involved in a car accident and I was in the hospital with brain damage. After this, my mother died in a car accident.

At that time, God sent you to me. I began to listen to your broadcasts and in January 2019 I started to go to church. You encouraged me to pray and I received peace and comfort from God. Thank you, Evgeny!” Ekaterina from Russia.

Wednesday – 3

Odessa will become one of four major studios of FEBC-Ukraine, where Ukrainian Christian leaders will broadcast daily.

Friday – 12

Please pray for Vlad Iurtov, our broadcaster in St. Petersburg. His programs and advice helped many listeners come to know the Lord. They attend evangelical churches and serve the Lord with joy.

Saturday – 13

Elena, 36, from St. Petersburg was in prison twice. After listening to FEBC broadcasts, she repented of her sins and accepted Jesus as her personal Savior. Two months ago, she made a decision to preach the Gospel to those who are in prisons and need salvation through Jesus Christ. Please pray that God will bless Elena and her work.

Sunday – 14

Tuesday – 16

Russia is leading the world in teen suicides. Ukraine is not far behind. Please pray for Pastor Andrey in Moscow, who had been FEBC's volunteer for many years. Dozens of young people found purpose in continuing to live because of his programs. They are now living with Jesus in their hearts. Pray that many lives will be saved this summer - for now and all eternity.

Wednesday – 17

Please pray for Evgeny Goltsov, our leader in Kiev, Ukraine. Evgeny has many ministry responsibilities and is involved in various projects. Pray that God will give him wisdom and bless his work.

Thursday – 18

Please pray for Rev. Oleg Shevkun, FEBC's senior broadcaster in Moscow. He works successfully with non-Christian university students who participate in his programs. Non-believing young listeners enjoy his broadcasts and talk to Oleg about their needs and faith in God. Many of them became Christians through Oleg's programs.
